

Research Highlights: Recent Recommendations

- During the 2025 session, numerous bills and budget items relating to telehealth were introduced by both members of the State Senate and House of Delegates.
- The increased interest in telehealth was due to the work of the Joint Commission of Health Care, the House Select Committee on Rural Health and other legislative committees and commissions throughout 2024.
- While, unfortunately, not every initiative expanding telehealth services was possible due to budget concerns, the legislative items below are likely to pass the General Assembly:
 - <u>SB 843</u>: Study to expand remote patient monitoring for patients with chronic conditions
 - HB 1945: Remote patient monitoring during pregnancy, pilot program
 - SB 1038: DBHDS to develop best practices for telehealth when serving patients with disabilities

Research Highlights: ATA's 2025 Policy Priorities

- Withdraw "Special Registration for Telemedicine and Limited State Telemedicine Registrations" proposed rule
- Permanently allow for the remote prescribing of controlled substances
- For the commercially insured: pre-deductible coverage for telehealth services
- For workers who don't qualify for coverage:
 employers can provide telehealth or other remote care services (IRS excepted benefit)
- Ensure all provider home addresses remain confidential
- Expand Medicare Diabetes Prevention Program
- Reinstate virtual cardiopulmonary rehab programs

Research Highlights: ATA's 2025 Policy Priorities

- Make permanent the Medicare Telehealth Flexibilities:
 - Remove geographic and originating-site restrictions
 - Ensure FQHCs and RHCs continue telehealth with fair reimbursement
 - Expand the list of eligible Medicare providers
 - Maintain audio-only coverage
 - Repeal the telemental health in-person requirement
 - Acute Hospital Care at Home Program

2021 Virginia State Telehealth Plan

CORE STRATEGY 1 – INCLUSION OF TELEHEALTH SERVICES IN OPERATING PROCEDURES

- Hospitals and primary care facilities
- Public primary and secondary schools and state funded post-secondary schools
- Emergency medical services agencies
- State agencies

CORE STRATEGY 2 - REMOTE PATIENT MONITORING

- Promote use of RPM and store-and-forward technologies, including with patients with chronic illness
- Assess cost of telehealth and broadband access
- Assess access for individuals with disabilities
- Data monitoring and management

2021 Virginia State Telehealth Plan

CORE STRATEGY 3 – UNIFORM AND INTEGRATED CRITERIA

- Review of State EMS Formulary to rule in/rule out procedures that may be telehealth appropriate
- Revision criteria for the Board of Health to incorporate accepted changes in medical practice and appropriate use of new and effective innovations in telehealth technologies, or to respond to needs indicated by analysis of data on patient outcomes

CORE STRATEGY 4 – INTEGRATION INTO OTHER PLANS

- State Health Plan
- Statewide Emergency Medical Services Plan
- Statewide Trauma Triage Plan
- Stroke Triage Plan
- Other state plans

CORE STRATEGY 5 - MAINTENANCE OF THE PLAN through the development of...

- An innovative payment model for emergency services that covers patient transport to a destination providing services of appropriate patient acuity and facilitates in-place treatment services
- Uniform procedures for establishing and recording patient informed consent for the use of telehealth services
- Appropriate liability protection for providers involved in such telehealth consultation and treatment

CORE STRATEGY 6 - DATA COLLECTION

- Establish minimum documentation requirements and a registry of telehealth businesses
- Potential for reducing unnecessary: in-patient hospital stays; pre- and inter-hospital transfers
- Impact of the use of telehealth services on patient morbidity, mortality, and the quality of life
- Impact on annual expenditures for health care services for all payers, including expenditures by third-party payers and out-of-pocket expenditures by patients



Telehealth in the Commonwealth

- Following surveys, focus groups, and stakeholder interviews, several themes have emerged regarding the current impact and future potential of telehealth in Virginia.
- These themes coalesced into a central question of:
 - How can we best utilize TELEHEALTH as a <u>solution</u> to achieve the priorities of the Commonwealth of Virginia?
- This doesn't limit its potential to only physical wellness but rather, creates a framework for exploring how telehealth can benefit the educational, workforce, connectivity, public safety, infrastructure objectives that create a **healthier Virginia**.

Telehealth Themes: From Stakeholder Perspectives

Broadband and technology access

Leverage infrastructure opportunities to achieve cross-sector gains

What this could look like...

- Collaboration between health and education on e-learning and telehealth access points
- Partnership with public libraries to train technology navigators that can support multiple citizen needs - including telehealth

Care innovations

Deploying proven models that can positively impact the health of Virginia's communities

What this could look like...

- Mobile integrated health care
- Virtual SUD supports
- Prioritize maternity care deserts for technology infrastructure support
- Child protection opportunities including virtual parenting supports

Telehealth Themes: From Stakeholder Perspectives

Person-centered accommodations

Care that supports our wonderfully diverse communities

What this could look like...

- Assistive technology collaborations with local community centers
- Establish best practice guidance for telehealth access points in affordable housing developments
- Network of virtual medical interpreters

Solutions tailored for high-need areas

Improving network adequacy in HPSAs and MUAs with an emphasis on improving access to care

What this could look like...

- Audio-only options when video feeds are unstable
- Address barriers to loan repayment options for telehealth providers

Telehealth Themes: From Stakeholder Perspectives

Sustainability, quality & efficacy

Aligning in-person, virtual, and technology standards

What this could look like...

- Licensing board guidance on telehealth certification requirements and best practices
- Development of device standards and best practices
- Payment parity

Workforce development & optimization

Expanding telehealth capacity to achieve Virginia's workforce goals

What this could look like...

- Virtual medical interpreter training
- Digital navigator training partnership with state community colleges
- Interstate compact "state of the state"
- Military medics training partnership with Veterans Services
